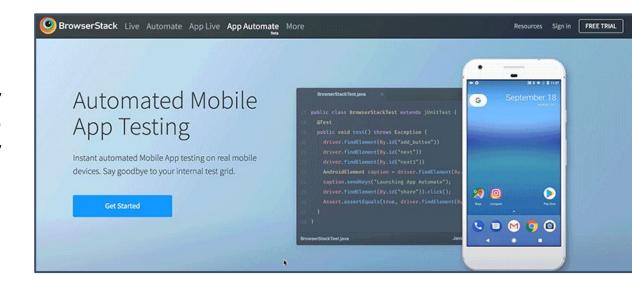
Final Architecture

Instant access to wide range of Real iOS and Android devices for more accurate App testing results.

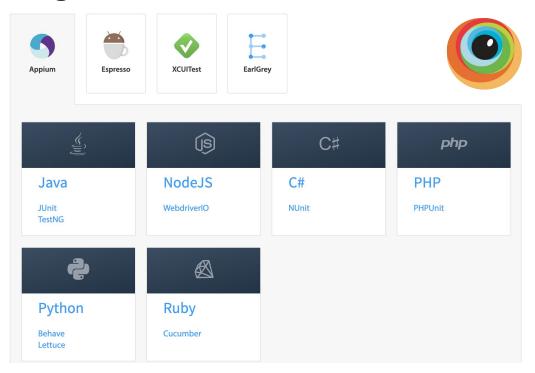


Debug and fix instantly

| #Install using rubygems gem install 'appium_lib' gem install selenium-webdriver |
| Step 2: Upload your app Upload your Android app (.apk file) or iOS app (.ipa file) to the BrowserStack servers using the REST API. |

Docker

Creating your own Dockerfile

- 1. Create layer from some ruby version;
- Execute the installations that is required inside your container;
- 3. Copy your folder to a new folder created in the Docker Image;
- Install your project dependencies with bundle install.

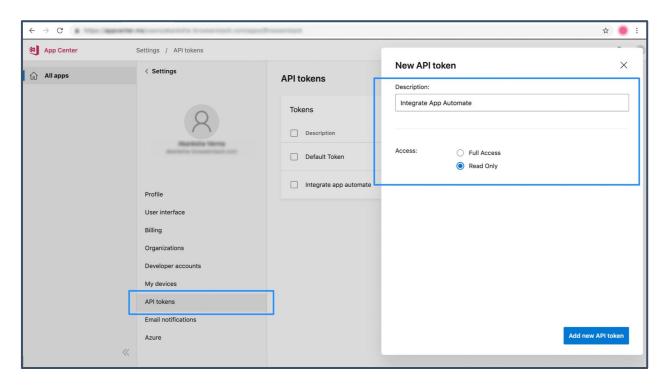

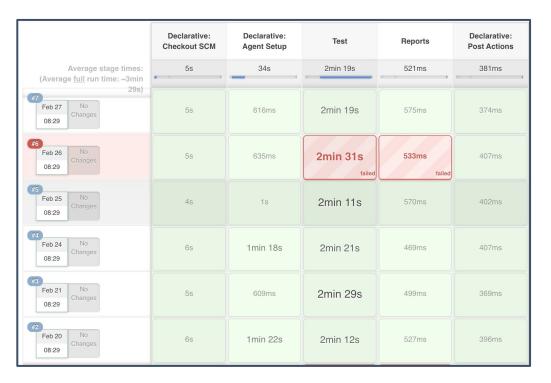
